

Heart-leaved Stringybark

Scientific Name:

Eucalyptus camfieldii

Conservation Status in NSW:

Vulnerable

National Conservation Status:

Vulnerable



SPECIAL NOTE: *Eucalyptus camfieldii* is restricted to a few stands on shallow soiled sandstone or laterite on ridgetops.

Description:

Heart-leaved Stringybark is a small tree or mallee with thick, broad and oblong to almost circular leaves which easily distinguish it from other stringybarks.

Habitat:

Eucalyptus camfieldii is restricted to a few stands on shallow soiled sandstone or laterite on ridgetops. It is found in association with *Angophora hispida*, *Eucalyptus haemastoma* (Scribbly Gum), and *Eucalyptus oblonga*.

Threats:

Habitat loss through expanding urban areas and habitat degradation from inappropriate fire regimes, illegal track creation and weed invasion.

Community Action:

Warringah residents can protect plants such *Eucalyptus camfieldii* by having a "bush-friendly" garden which reduces the threat of weed invasions into nearby bushland.
