SPECIAL NOTE: *Pimelea curviflora var curviflora* is only found in three isolated locations in Warringah.

Description:

Pimelea curviflora var curviflora is a small erect shrub that reaches a height of 50cm. Its stems are covered in small hairy leaves and produces flowers that have brown-green sepals with red centres and a red, curve and hairy tube. The flowers are produced in spring.

Habitat:

Pimelea curviflora var. curviflora is an understorey woodland plant found in only three isolated locations in Warringah.

Threats:

Pimelea curviflora var curviflora is threatened by urban expansion and habitat degradation.

Community Action:

Warringah residents, particularly those living in Frenchs Forest, can help protect plants such *Pimelea curviflora var curviflora* by having a "bush friendly" garden to reduce the threat of weed invasions into nearby bushland. Residents may also like to join a bushcare group such as Warringah's "Friends of the Bush" to help regenerate areas already threatened by weed invasion.
