

STATUTORY STATEMENT PURSUANT TO CLAUSE 175 OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING & ASSESSMENT REGULATIONS 2000

I, being the owner of the building described above, or on behalf of the owner, certify that:

- (a) Each essential fire safety measure listed above has been assessed by a properly qualified person and was found, when it was assessed, to be capable of performing;
- (i) in the case of an essential fire safety measure applicable by virtue of a fire safety schedule to a standard no less than that specified in the schedule;
- or
- (ii) in the case of an essential fire safety measure applicable otherwise than by virtue of a fire safety schedule, to a standard no less than that to which the measure was originally designed and implemented, and
- (b) The building has been inspected by a properly qualified person and was found, when it was inspected, to be in a condition that did not disclose any grounds for a prosecution under Division 7 - Miscellaneous Fire Safety Offences;
- Fail to display or interfere with/remove/damage fire safety notice as prescribed by Clause 183 EPA Regulations 2000 in Fire Isolated Exits
 - Place things/obstruct/impede the operation of Fire Door
 - Fail to keep Egress Paths clear.
- (c) The information contained in the statement is true and accurate to the best of my knowledge and belief.

The owner of the building, or person on behalf of the owner, must sign and date the statement.

Note: The date of the Statement is the issue date and becomes the anniversary date in twelve months.
